

CAMP ROSALIE

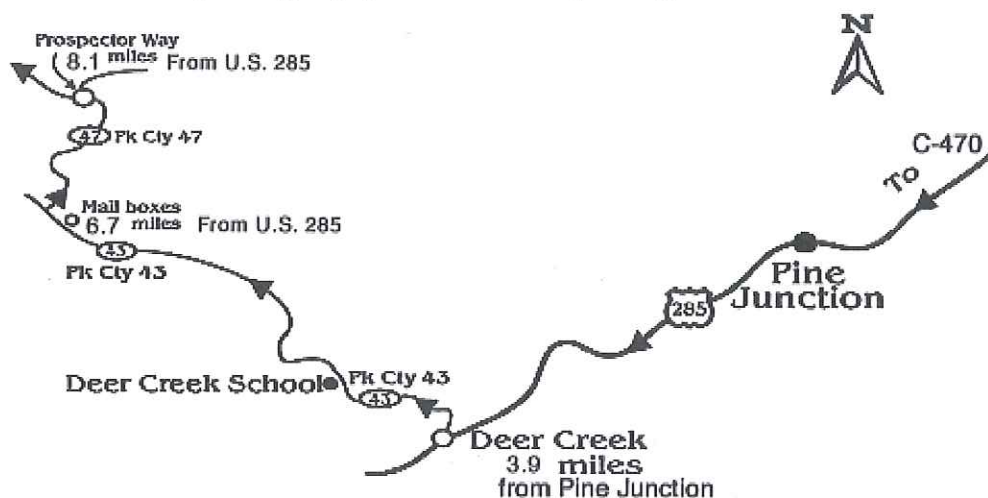

From Denver, take Hwy 285 SW approximately 25 miles from C-470. Turn right (N) on Park County Road 43A (marked by the Loaf-N-Jug). Travel 6.8 miles on CR 43 and turn right (NE) onto Park County Rd 47 (a group of mailboxes marks the fork in the road).

Travel 1.3 miles on CR 47 and turn left (W) on Prospector Way.

Take the far left road marked by the sign for Camp Rosalie.

Follow this road (CR 13) about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile to the sign for Camp Rosalie on your right (N). Turn into the parking area. Welcome!



Camp Rosalie sits on six beautiful acres of the Pike National Forest and is made up of lodgepole and ponderosa pines and large groves of aspens. The camp has large open meadows and a small stream flows nearby. Camp Rosalie is home to diverse wildlife including elk, fox, and bats. Many small mammals and species of birds also call camp home. Bears only pass through.

Camp Rosalie was founded in 1934 by Washington Park United Methodist Church and was passed on to Crossroads Church of Denver in the fall of 2002. The camp has always served primarily as a children's summer camp and that remains its focus. Camp Rosalie is currently operated as a ministry of Crossroads Church of Denver and is **not open to the public**.

Camp facilities include four camper cabins and three cabins for staff and volunteers for a maximum group of 59 people. Other facilities include the lodge, with full-service kitchen and dining room, the showerhouse, and four outhouses. The buildings are not winterized and Camp Rosalie is therefore open roughly seven months of the year. Recreational activities include volleyball, frisbee golf, and horseshoes. A group of team challenge elements is also under construction.
